About the Activity

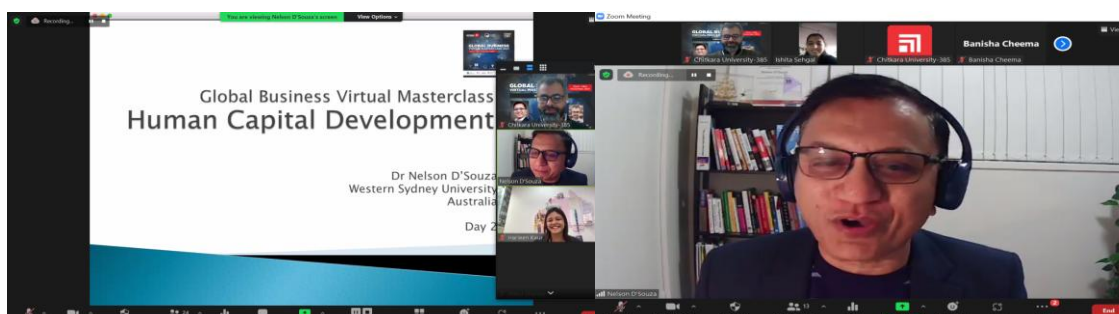
