





#### EXPERT TALK ON WORLD AUTISM DAY Date: 02<sup>nd</sup> APRIL 2016

World Awareness Autism Day was celebrated by Chitkara College of Education for Women in collaboration with Mowhawk College, Fanshawe College, Canada and SOREM Chandigarh, under the module EDGlobal and EDMentor for the aLPHA TEACHERS'. The Interns of Mowhawk College, Fanshawe College, Canada, gave a brief presentation about the overview of Autism, it's signs, symptoms, communication strategies (verbal or nonverbal), behavioral strategies to be followed with the Autistic Children. aLPHA TEACHERS' were also briefed about the effective teaching strategies like ABA (Applied Behavior Analysis), reinforcement (positive and negative both) and its impact on children. 



Further, the SHO sends a police constable to her place to record her complaint. This is in case a woman is not in a position to physically go to a police station and file a complaint), right against being stalked (Section 354D of the IPC makes way for legal action to be taken against an offender if he/she follows a woman, tries to contact her to foster personal interaction repeatedly despite a clear indication of disinterest; or monitor the use by

a woman of the internet, email or any other form of electronic communication). The session was really very interesting and it made everyone aware of the current scenario of women's legal rights.



#### Introduction

Heritage significance refers to the core values of a heritage place for which we want to conserve it. Understanding heritage significance is the fundamental first step of any heritage conservation and management process. A thorough understanding of significance provides a strong basis for sound conservation and management decisions. It is also imperative for the public, including visitors, to know what is so significant about a place that it warrants special efforts for its safeguarding. This understanding makes conservation meaningful for everyone and generates support for it. Interpretation and Presentation make the significance of a heritage place accessible to everyone.

Interpretation refers to the full range of potential activities intended to heighten public awareness and enhance understanding of cultural heritage site. These can include print and electronic publications, public lectures, on-site and directly related off-site installations, educational programmes, community activities, and ongoing research, training, and evaluation of the interpretation process itself.

**Presentation** more specifically denotes the carefully planned communication of interpretive content through the arrangement of interpretive information, physical access, and interpretive infrastructure at a cultural heritage site. It can be conveyed through a variety of technical means, including, yet not requiring, such elements as informational panels, museum-type displays, formalized walking tours, lectures and guided tours, and multimedia applications and websites.

This workshop focuses exactly on this: how to help locals and visitors understand the heritage significance of a place through interpretation and presentation.

#### Modern Heritage

The assessment of heritage significance of modern heritage and its interpretation is relatively a new topic in heritage education. When compared to archaeological sites or ancient monuments, modern heritage has a relatively short history and its architectural value is often its most visible quality.

#### **Brochure of the Workshop**

Consequently, the architectural value often gets the highest regards in the interpretation and presentation of modern heritage sites. However, modern heritage also represent significant stages of our recent history and many of them over time have acquired significant social meanings. This workshop provides us a unique opportunity to discuss this within the context of Panjab University's special architectural ensemble of the modern movement.

#### Modern Architecture of the Panjab University

Chandigarh is a historic city relatively new and planned as a synthesis of modern movement in architecture. Interpretation is especially important when the significance of a resource isn't immediately obvious to visitors. As an example of modern architecture, the edifices of Chandigarh are essentially an architect's architecture. They can be too abstract and perplexing for common man to comprehend and appreciate.

Built from 1960 onwards, this area differs from other areas of Chandigarh essentially on account of its function, activity structure, the extremely generous scale of its open spaces and unusual architectural vocabulary not used elsewhere in the city. It also becomes significant for containing a collection of buildings representing a different aspect of Pierre Jeanneret's creative potential.(1999, Joshi) The original buildings consist of the Gandhi Bhawan, University Library, administration building, and hostels. Other significant buildings also include the student centre and the arts gallery from the 1980's.

  - d. How these data will be analysed.

2. An annotated but schematic map/plan of a walking trail that connects the key elements of the workshop area in a meaningful way. It should also show the interpretative infrastructure necessary to make users and visitors understand the significance. You should provide sufficient reasons for your choice and state how the trail can be linked to its (potential) heritage significance. We are not expecting a fully developed walking trail.

# PREFACE - THE NEED FOR ARCHITECTURAL INTERVENTION IN VILLAGES:


India has seen an unprecedented economic growth in the last few decades primarily because of urban activities. But it would not be right to limit the definition of 'developed India' to its urban centers. The term must necessarily include the development of the backbone of India - its rural strength. Scattered throughout India are more than 6,45,00 villages. It is in these villages that India's most basic occupation **–agriculture** - takes place.

Today our villages are facing many problems due to lack of engineering and architecture initiatives. From limited or no access to design talent, technology and new and improved building methods, our villages are being forced to remain as crumbling units of past. Therefore, there is a need to address the problem and bridge the urban-rural gap. If India is to aim for sustained growth, it is important that villages in India should be evolving as one of our strengths and at par with urban India. The main challenge is to provide lacking infrastructural facilities and upgrade the existing ones by bringing the creativity of technical education to spaces and places needed, in short developing sensitivity towards designing for rural environments.

# Circular regarding village Study

# THE STUDY AREA:

The chosen village for study and intervention is Jhansla, design Rajpura, Punjab. The village is accessed from the Chandigarh Patiala National Highway. It lies in close vicinity to Chitkara University (approximately 1.5 kms). The study area has been chosen keeping in mind its proximity to the college, easy approach and the small size of the village which would enable documentation to be completed within the limited time. The village also has various types of development issues, all of which will help students to understand the needs of such environments and propose contextrelated solutions. The location plan and Google earth image have been attached for your reference. The village has population of 1542 as per Population Census 2001 and a total settlement area is 20 hectares approx.



# METHODOLOGY OF STUDY:

The study would be undertaken in groups each of 6-7 students. Each team will be allotted a specific are/zone for a Land-use plan, detailed survey, analysis and proposing a Design project for Gap filling in the settlement. They are expected to follow the methodology given below:

## a. RECONNAISSANCE SURVEY:

Since the Design Phase of the Project would cover the entire village, it is imperative that each team regardless of the area allocated to it for detailed analysis, visits the entire village, navigating their way through various lanes and neighborhoods with the help of the provided Google Earth map of the village. During this preliminary visit, each group is expected to record their first impressions regarding the physical characteristics (such as streets patterns, building types, open spaces, etc) as well as non-physical characteristics (such as villagers, their lifestyle, occupation, etc) of the village through notes, sketches, photographs, interviews and observations.
